I met with members of the Heber Springs Chamber of Commerce. Small businesses are the backbone of our economy. In Washington, I'm supporting policies that promote economic growth so we can help these businesses and owners succeed.



The Nature Conservancy is working to protect our land and water. I'm committed to helping protect these natural resources. During my time in Clinton, I had the opportunity to see the conservation projects along the Upper Little Red River and hear how federal programs help

protect Greers Ferry Lake.



Boston Mountain Rural Health Center was awarded \$285,000 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as part of a national effort to combat opioid addiction. I talked with health care professionals about how they are using the funds to implement effective treatment, recovery and prevention methods to fight this epidemic.

## and Newton County Sheriff Glenn Wheeler at Ozark Cafe.





## **Quick Takes:**

- Securing the Border: A humanitarian and security crisis exists along our southern border that requires immediate action. It is in our national interest to secure the border. That is why I supported President Trump's call for additional resources to fund the construction of a strong border security system.
- Reducing Veteran Suicides: I'm leading efforts to improve the VA's operation, oversight and evaluation of its suicide prevention media outreach campaigns as the lead Republican cosponsor of the <u>Reach Every Veteran in Crisis Act.</u> This bill will help Congress and the VA isolate meaningful suicide prevention programs so we can ensure resources are focused on efforts that save lives.
- Green New Deal Reality Check: This all-encompassing, far-left wish list is unaffordable, unworkable and unrealistic. I <u>talked about the massive costs and the government expansion</u> the proposal seeks to achieve under the pretense of ending climate change. Majority Leader Mitch McConnell indicated that senators will have an opportunity to let Americans know where they stand on this poorly designed plan when he brings the Green New Deal up for a vote in the near future. It should easily be voted down.
